**Sandy Lada** from Bloomfield, Michigan, creates glass beads using Moretti rods in a process using an oxygen/propane mixture called lampwork. All beads are kiln annealed and worked into whimsical and fun pieces.

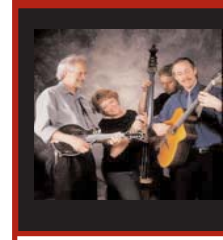

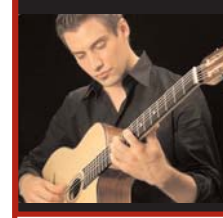
*5th Annual Gypsy Swing Festival*

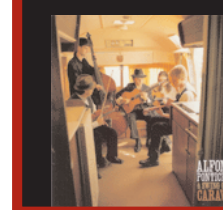

Hailed by fans, critics and musicologists alike as champions and luminaries of the style, award winning Harmonious Wail brings the tradition of Gypsy Jazz to life with refreshing energy and undeniable passion.



**Kruno Spisic** creates a new branch of gypsy jazz by fusing Eastern European Folk Traditions with Django swing. This new merging of sounds enraptures listeners with its sweet Balkan melodies, romantic songs and hot jazz.



**Stephane Wrembel** composes and plays Gypsy music with a unique sound; blending influences from all over the world, allowing room for space and more rhythm possibilities. A sound he calls, Gypsy Jam.



**Alfonso Ponticelli and Swing Gitan**, Chicago's premier Gypsy Jazz ensemble, plays foot-tappin' swing on acoustic instruments. It's a blend of the jubilant swing of early jazz with the feisty passion of gypsy music, plus a strong dose of guitar pyrotechnics and virtuosic improvisation.



**Broadwing Clay Studios** with Ric Lamore from Cambridge, WI is an Art in the Barn favorite. Whether you're looking for that perfect artistic piece to adorn your home or functional tableware, Ric's delightful style and purity of form will add dimension and beauty to your world.
